Output:

1. 80% of women heads of households and in conditions of economic hardship are informed of their rights and trained in the agricultural management, production and sale of agricultural products.
2. 2 nurseries for the reproduction of local tree species, for the functional re-naturalization of the buffer zones, they are set up and equipped and donated to 2 female associations with experience in the commercial management of nurseries, which have been collaborating with ASIA for some time in the field of horticulture.
3. 15 hectares of marginal areas are planted with native tree species, selected based on the technical analyses already carried out in 2018 and characterized by a population in reduction in the park; the plants will be functional to support the non-wood supply chains of the project, in particular honey and branches for animal nutrition.
4. 120 families are trained and equipped to start or expand the beekeeping activity in the buffer zones, near the new re-settlement represented by the 15 re-naturalized hectares capable of providing nourishment and protection to bee colonies. Each family will receive 5 improved beehives for 600 production beehives.
5. 12 families are trained in the production of saprophytic mushrooms destined for sale that are enjoying great market demand in Nepal. 6 families in the first year and the remaining 6 in the second year will then be supported, financially and technically for the construction of 12 sheds equipped with irrigation systems.
6. 60 families of breeders are trained on the pruning techniques of tree-like plants for animal nutrition (planted in consociation on the 15 hectares of marginal areas) and are assigned to them 250 seedlings of suitable arboreal plants for planting near the houses and stables.

15. Successfully implemented a business plan for the self-sustainability of community social enterprises
16. Governance of local authorities strengthened through participatory planning on the marketing of local products, guaranteeing ownership of the development process
17. Created a system of sustainable marketing of seeds and spices through the improvement of the value chain and a correct use of the information system of the agricultural market
18. Improvement of learning achievement, hygiene and learning environment through the material and training to teachers, school and students

**Outcome:**

1. Empowerment of social and economic condition of rural women in Rasuwa district.
2. Disseminate models of use of natural resources with high adaptability and resistance to climate change, recovering marginal lands, and production capacity increment and the eco-system services provided.
3. Reduce the forms of illegal and indefensible exploitation of woody and non-woody forest resources within the park by fostering management models with low environmental impact.
4. To promote the re-naturalization of the Langtang Park, through the reintroduction of native species in the buffer zones, control of the expansion of alien species.
5. Increase the livelihood of the beneficiaries of the Naukunda RM through the commercial vegetable farming and cash crops cultivation
6. Promote the strengthening of the skills of women and young people in the districts of Kavrepalanchowk and Sindhupalchowk through the introduction of improved technologies for the increase in the production of quality seeds and spices
7. Strengthen the system of collection, selection, packaging and marketing of seeds, vegetables and spices by means of community social enterprises (made up of 60% women) created by improving the governance process of local authorities in the 2 selected districts
